Melissa O'Rourke, County Attorney, also updated the Board on the status of various District Court cases.

Dennis Lange, County Auditor, reported that a recent new hire in the County Sheriff's Department has not been paid for hours that were listed as deputy or reserve peace officer based upon review of memorandums issued by Melissa O'Rourke, County Attorney.

Dwayne Alons, State Representative; and Kenneth Veenstra, State Senator, met this the Board this date to discuss the various state budget cuts that have been passed along to local governmental entities in Sioux County. The Board expressed displeasure with the Iowa State Legislature for trying to balance the state budget at the cost of local governmental entities. The Board stated that the state budget cuts that have been passed along to local governmental entities in Sioux County have had a huge impact on their budgets. The Board stated that the only alternative would be to raise property taxes to offset decreases in state revenues. Also, the large decrease in rural taxable valuation will also create a shift in payment of property tax by classification of property. ## **RESOLUTION NO. 2004-01**

# CONSTRUCTION EVALUATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) (2003), sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors establishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

**WHEREAS**, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

**WHEREAS**, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2004 and January 31, 2005 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

**WHEREAS**, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SIOUX COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2004-02**

Whereas, a request was filed by the Hollander Family Investment Company for the subdivision of the following described real estate, to-wit:

That part of the W1/2 SE1/4 of Section 26, Township 97 North, Range 43 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P. M., in Sioux County, Iowa, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest corner of said W1/2 SE1/4; thence North 00° 07' 38" East along the West line of said W1/2 for 45.6 feet to a point on the North right-of-way line of U.S. Highway No. 18; thence South 88° 18' 06" East along said North right-of-way line for 418.00 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence North 00° 07' 38" East for 500.00 feet; thence South 88° 18' 06" East for 650.00 feet; thence South 00° 04' 31" West for 250.00 feet; thence, South 88° 18' 06" East for 240.00 feet; thence South 00° 10' 45" West for 250.00 feet to a point on the North right-of-way line of U.S. Highway No. 18; thence North 88° 18' 06" West along said North right-of-way line for 890.00 feet to the point of beginning.

Whereas, the Hollander Family Investment Company has filed preliminary and final plats with the County Zoning Administrator, and said plats have been duly reviewed by the Sioux County Planning and Zoning Commission and the City of Sheldon as required by the Sioux County Subdivision Regulations, and

Whereas, the Sioux County Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended approval of said final plat establishing six (6) residential lots with a (R-2) Single Family Residential Zoning Classification.

Whereas, the recommendations of the Sioux County Planning and Zoning Commission have been met and incorporated into said final plat, and

Whereas, the original Board of Supervisors' Resolution 98-21 approving said plat contained numerous typographical errors in the legal description of the above described premises, and

Whereas, the Board of Supervisors must enact a resolution approving the plat of the real estate as correctly described above.

Therefore, be it resolved by the Sioux County Board of Supervisors,

That a Variance is hereby granted from the minimum right of Way requirements, from 66 feet to 55 feet, for the private roadway easement on the lots of said subdivision, and that a covenant shall be attached to all deeds, contracts, or other instruments conveying an interest in any lot(s) of said Prairie Lanes Addition, to notify all holders of such instruments that the private roadway is not subject to dedication to Sioux County and not eligible for maintenance by the Court Secondary Road Department, and

That the property within the boundaries of said subdivision is hereby changed from an Agricultural District to a (R-2) Residential District, and that said change shall be an amendment to the Sioux County Zoning Map, and,

That the Final Plat of the Prairie Lanes Addition as herein correctly described, including variance, covenants, and zoning classification change, is hereby accepted and approved.
