

MINUTES OF SIOUX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

MEETING HELD ON FEBRUARY 24, 2004

The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met pursuant to adjournment at 9:30 o'clock a.m. with Chairman Mark Sybesma presiding. Members present were Loren Bouma, Vernon Beernink, Mark Sybesma, Bernard L. Smith and Stanley L. De Haan.

Minutes of February 17, 2004 were submitted and on motion and vote stand approved as submitted.

Melissa O'Rourke, County Attorney, met with the Board this date to report that Leesa McNeil, Third Judicial District Court Administrator, has decided that the Third Judicial District court schedule for calendar year 2005 will remain the same as the current 2004 calendar year schedule.

Melissa O'Rourke, County Attorney, also reviewed the provisions of Chapter 21, Code of Iowa, pertaining to the open meetings law for governmental entities.

Motion by Beernink and supported by Smith to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign a Class C Liquor License Renewal Application for Sandy Hollow Golf Association effective April 1, 2004. Carried, unanimous in favor.

Nola Aalberts, Decategorization /Empowerment Coordinator, reported on the following subject matters:

Decat Comprehensive Action Plan Goals and Targets pertaining to parenting skills, substance abuse and child care
Contracts budgeted during FY 2004 for empowerment, decategorization, promoting safe & stable families

As this was the date and 10:00 o'clock a.m. the time set for consideration and review of an Iowa Department of Natural Resources confinement operation construction permit application submitted by Bruce Dooyema of Center Fresh Egg Farm LLP, and located in the NE1/4NE1/4 of Section 14 in Center Township, said consideration and review was held according to law.

Mark Dunlop, County Emergency Management Services Director and Zoning Administrator, met with the Board this date to review the contents of the aforementioned Iowa Department of Natural Resources egg laying operation expansion construction permit application submitted by Center Fresh Egg Farm.

The Chairman closed the consideration and comment period.

Motion by Beernink and supported by Smith to approve a recommendation to support an Iowa Department of Natural Resources egg laying operation expansion construction permit application submitted by Bruce Dooyema of Sioux Center. The matrix score of 460 met the Iowa Department of Natural Resources requirements. Carried, unanimous in favor.

Nancy Dykstra, Executive Director of Community Health Partners of Sioux County, met with the Board this date to report on the last County Board of Health meeting and six month report covering the period from July through December, 2003. She also reported on the following subject matters:

Community Health Partners of Sioux County would be interested in entering into a two year agreement with Sioux County to provide nursing services to Sioux County residents
Comparison of levels of public health funding in Iowa for various counties

The County Board of Supervisors proceeded to conduct a court house facilities walk thru with Deb Fischer, Judicial Clerk III in the Sioux County Clerk of District Court Office; District Court Judge Jim Scott; and Supreme Court of Appeals Judge Terry Huitink, to assess various alternatives available to accommodate a space shortage affecting the Clerk of Court's office, jury room and other county offices. No decision was made.
