- **12-03-06 1** The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met on March 6, 2012, at 9:00 o'clock a.m. with Chairman Mark Sybesma presiding. Members present were Al Bloemendaal, John Degen, Arlyn Kleinwolterink, Mark Sybesma and Dennis Wright.
- **12-03-06 2** Minutes of the meeting held on February 28, 2012, were submitted and the Chairman declared them approved.

12-03-06 3 Coleman McAllister, Sioux County Attorney

- Informed the Board that the County will be purchasing some land for additional gravel rights.
- Noted that in regard to the decision made at last week's meeting, a legal challenge may be made about the decision within 30 days from last Tuesday. Reported that the decision of the Board is final and a new plan would need to be submitted to Planning and Zoning Board for the sportsman's complex to be reconsidered.

12-03-06 4 Nate Huizenga, Emergency Management Director

- Requested fiscal sponsorship by Sioux County for grants that will be applied for from
 the Siouxland Community Foundation. The maximum amount that may be requested
 for these grants is \$10,000. Organizations applying for the grants are the Sioux
 County Firefighter Association and the Sioux County Dive Team. Motion by Degen
 and supported by Kleinwolterink to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign fiscal
 agent agreements for the above mentioned organizations. Motion carried, unanimous

- Section 1. The Sioux County Board of Supervisors has received notice from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) that Walt Vander Wal (Rolling View Farms, Inc.-East) has been issued a draft permit for confinement feeding operation facility ID #66576.
- Section 2, The Sioux County Board of Supervisors reviewed the construction permit application and the manure management plan and determined that both appeared to be in compliance with the requirements of the Master Matrix, Iowa Code Section 459 and Iowa DNR rules and recommended approval of said application on February 7, 2012.
- Section 3. The Sioux County Board of Supervisors hereby waives its right to appeal the issuance of the final permit within the fourteen (14) day limit from the time of receipt of notice of the issuance of the draft permit.
- Section 4. The Sioux County Board of Supervisors encourages the Iowa DNR to issue the Final Permit immediately upon notification of this waiver.
- Section 5. The Sioux County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Board Chairman to notify the Iowa DNR of this waiver.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-10

APPROVING THE SALE OF SIOUX COUNTY'S LEGAL INTEREST IN CERTAIN EXCESS RIGHT OF WAY REAL PROPERTY TO FLORAL PLANT GROWERS L.L.C.

WHEREAS, Sioux County has legal title to certain real property consisting of approximately 0.275 acres located adjacent to Jackson Avenue consisting of excess right of way easement legally described as follows:

A survey of excess right of way in the southeast quarter (SE ½) of Section 29 (Sec. 29), Township 97 North (T97N), Range 44 West (R44W) of the Fifth Principal Meridian, in Sioux County, State of Iowa; more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the SE cor. of Sec. 29, T97N, R44W of the Fifth Principal Meridian; thence N00°00'17"E, 49.58 Feet along the easterly line of SE ¼ of said Sec.; thence N88°42'18"W, 50.00 feet, to the point of beginning; thence continuing N88°42'18"W, 25.00 feet; thence N00°00'17"E, 348.72 feet; thence S89°59'43"E, 15.00 feet; thence N00°00'17"E, 325.00 feet; thence S89°59'43"E, 10.00 feet, to a point which is S00°00'17"W, 98.48 feet of the southeasterly lot corner of address 3181 Jackson Ave. having a county P.I.N. number of 05-29-476-010; thence S00°00'17" W, 674.28 feet, to the point of beginning, containing 11,979.3 Sq. Ft. or 0.275 acres.

WHEREAS, Sioux County has further negotiated an agreement with Floral Plant Growers L.L.C., a Delaware Limited Liability Company, whereby Sioux County would dispose of its interest in the above legally described property by transferring ownership to Floral Plant Growers L.L.C. in return for Sioux County receiving \$3,354.20 in cash.

WHEREAS, the Board, by prior resolution (2012–06), as required by Iowa Code Section 331.361, described the proposed property disposition set forth above; set a public hearing on the proposed property disposition; timely published notice of the time and place of the public hearing on the proposed property disposition; and the Board conducted a public hearing on March 6, 2012, to solicit public comment and input on the proposed property disposition prior to finally acting on such proposal.

WHEREAS, the Board has further complied with the requirements of Iowa Code Section 306.23 and further the purchase price equals or exceeds the fair market value of the land as determined by an independent appraisal of the property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Sioux County that the proposed property disposition, as described above, is in the best interest of the citizens of Sioux County and all parties concerned; that the proposed property disposition as drafted, advertised, heard, and discussed be adopted; that the above described property conveyance be approved and authorized by the Board. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute and deliver documents and pay any related costs necessary to follow through with the disposal of Sioux County's property interest in the above legally described property. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict.

The O'Brien County Board of Supervisors requested that Sioux County allow County Engineer, Doug Julius to help out with matters that require an Engineers signature. Attorneys from both counties will draft 28E Agreements to enable the Sioux County Engineer to perform some necessary duties in O'Brien County until a replacement can be hired.
