- **12-05-15 1** The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met on May 15, 2012, at 9:00 o'clock a.m. with Chairman Mark Sybesma presiding. Members present were Al Bloemendaal, John Degen, Arlyn Kleinwolterink, Mark Sybesma and Dennis Wright.
- **12-05-15 2** Minutes of the meeting held on May 1, 2012, were submitted and the Chairman declared them approved.
- 12-05-15 3 Coleman McAllister, Sioux County Attorney requested that the Board sign an easement agreement with Greg Lynott et al for property adjoining the Big Sioux Recreation Area. Motion by Degen and supported by Bloemendaal to approve the purchase of real estate for use by the Sioux County Conservation Board. Roll call on vote: Kleinwolterink, Yes; Degen, Yes; Bloemendaal, Yes; Wright, Yes; and Sybesma, Yes. Motion carried, unanimous in favor.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2012-23**

### APPROVING AND ENTERING INTO A REAL ESTATE EASEMENT AGREEMENT WITH GREG LYNOTT ET AL.

**WHEREAS**, Sioux County, acting through the Sioux County Conservation Board, has negotiated a real estate easement agreement with Gregory P. Lynott and Denise Lynott and Dwaine B. De Groot and Linda R. De Groot concerning the following legally described property:

The East Half of the Southwest Quarter, the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter, and a part of Government Lot Three (3) all in Section Three (3); and a part of Government Lots One (1) and Two (2) in Section Four (4); all in Township Ninety-Four (94) North, Range Forty-Eight (48) West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M., designated Parcel D as shown by Plat of Survey recorded in the 2011 File-Card No. 5592 EXCEPT the East 91.27 acres of said Parcel D (hereinafter referred to as DeGroot Property); and,

That part of Government lot Three (3) in Section Three (3); and that part of Government Lots One (1) and Two (2) in Section Four (4); all in Township Ninety-Four (94) North, Range Forty-Eight (48) West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M., designated Parcel E as shown by Plat of Survey recorded in the 2011 File-Card No. 5593, subject to public highway (hereinafter referred to as County Property); and,

The North Half of Section Nine Township ninety-Four (94) North, Range Forty-Eight (48) West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M. (hereinafter referred to as Lynott Property).

WHEREAS, Sioux County desires to enter into the easement agreement concerning the above legally described property in order to access the property for conservation purposes and for such other public purposes as otherwise contemplated by the Sioux County Conservation Board and the easement agreement; and to formalize the agreement with Gregory Lynott concerning his access to county owned property for purposes of accessing his property for agricultural purposes as more particularly set forth in the easement agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors of Sioux County that the proposed easement agreement is in the best interests of the citizens of Sioux County and all parties concerned; that the proposed easement contemplated by the real estate easement agreement therein as drafted, heard, and discussed be adopted; that Sioux County accept the conveyance of the above-described property from the parties listed above for easement purposes, and that the above-described property

conveyance as contemplated in the easement agreement be approved and authorized by the Board. The Board further agrees to accept the transfer of the easement to the real property described above to be managed and utilized by Sioux County for public purposes as more particularly set forth in the easement agreement. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute and deliver documents and pay any related costs necessary to follow through with the approved transfer proposal in acquiring an easement to the real property described above and to grant access to the Lynott Property for agricultural purposes as more particularly set forth in the easement agreement. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict.

### 12-05-15 4 Dan Altena, Sioux County Sheriff

- Reported that he has given the rank of Major to Jason Bergsma and Jamie Van Voorst. Each of these officers oversees approximately half of the deputies in the Sheriff's Department. The salary of both employees is 85% of the Sheriff's salary. This report was received for information.
- Requested that the Board approve and that the Chairman sign Contract Law Agreements with the following cities in Sioux County: Boyden, \$73,692; Granville, \$21,422; Hospers, \$73,692; Hull, \$238,213; and Maurice, \$17,138. Chatsworth will no longer contract with Sioux County. Motion by Wright and supported by Kleinwolterink to approve Contract Law Agreements as submitted by Altena. Motion carried, unanimous in favor.
- Informed the Board that a recent inspection of the jail resulted in two issues being cited. Noted was the fact that hourly jail checks were not properly documented. The jail commander has notified employees of the necessity of proper documentation. The other issue was that there are cracks in the ceiling of the dayrooms. Upon investigation the Sheriff found that precast concrete seams are showing.
- **12-05-15 5** Shane Walter, Sioux County Zoning Administrator met with the Board to introduce two public hearings.
- 12-05-15 6 As this was the date and 9:30 a.m. the time set for a Public Hearing to consider a Planning and Zoning Commission recommendation to rezone parcel 12-23-476-001 from agricultural to light industrial, the Chairman opened said hearing. Scott Mulder was present for this discussion. Mulder stated that he would like to make the area in question more usable. Boat storage is one anticipated improvement. The Chairman closed the hearing. Motion by Kleinwolterink and supported by Wright to approve the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission to rezone parcel 12-23-476-001. Roll call on vote: Kleinwolterink, Yes; Degen, Yes; Bloemendaal, Yes; Wright, Yes; and Sybesma, Yes. Motion carried, unanimous in favor.

### **RESOLUTION NO 2012 - 20**

WHEREAS, a petition has been received from Scott Mulder, requesting an amendment to the Sioux County Zoning Ordinance and the Sioux County Zoning Map to change the Zoning Classification of a property, approximately three (3) acres in size, described herein, from an AG (Agricultural District) to an LI (Light Industrial District):

### PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

That part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 08, of Nassau Township 94 North, Range 44 West, 5th Prime Meridian, currently recorded by deed in the 2004 File at Card 4266.

WHEREAS, said property is located in an area currently zoned for, and bordered by, Agricultural uses,

WHEREAS, the current primary usage of said property is for fuel storage, defined by the County Zoning Ordinance as a Light Industrial Use, and approved by the Zoning Board of Adjustment as a Special Exception, Permit 2004-19, and,

WHEREAS, said usage is not in major conflict with the Sioux County Land Use Plan, and,

WHEREAS, the Sioux County Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended approval of the proposed zoning classification change on the property described and shown on the area site plan attached to this petition.

THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Sioux County Board of Supervisors, that the Zoning Classification of said property be changed from an Agricultural District to a Light Industrial District, and that said change shall be effective on publication of this resolution.
