

**MINUTES OF SIOUX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**  
**MEETING HELD ON MAY 18, 2010**

**10-05 18 1** The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 o'clock a.m. with Chairman Mark Sybesma presiding. Members present were Arlyn Kleinwolterink, Mark Sybesma, Al Bloemendaal and Dennis Wright. Supervisor John Degen was not present for this meeting.

**10-05 18 2** Minutes of the meeting held on May 11, 2010, were submitted and the Chairman declared them approved.

**10-05 18 3** Coleman McAllister, Sioux County Attorney

- Introduced Daniel Solis, a Northwestern College student who will be interning in the County attorney's office this summer.
- Reviewed progress on an appeal for a stay being heard on shutting down a disposal pit in the western part of Sioux County. The judge has not ruled on the conditions of the appeal yet, but the bond will be set possibly later today. Judge Ackerman will be hearing the case. The case may not be heard until September.

**10-05 18 4** At the May 4, 2010, meeting a Public Hearing was scheduled to be held on May 25, 2010, to amend the 2009-2010 Sioux County Budget. This amendment would allow the County to lend \$180,000 to the Sioux County Communications Board for an upgrade to the County Communications Center. Payment for equipment will not need to be made until Fiscal Year 2011, so it has been determined that this amendment will not need to be made until that fiscal year. Motion by Wright and supported by Kleinwolterink to table the Public Hearing until Fiscal Year 2011. Motion carried, unanimous in favor, one member absent.

**10-05 18 5** Shane Walter, Sioux County Community Services Director met with the Board to discuss the need for office space for six additional Department of Human Services workers in the DHS building. Several options are being considered. The building committee will continue to work with Walter and the janitorial staff in cooperation with representatives from the Iowa Department of Human Services to implement the necessary changes.

**10-05 18 6** Rob Klocke, County Conservation Administrator and Conservation Board Member, Don Brommer spoke about the grant application process and applications for future projects. Funding was received for a portion of a hiking trail. Klocke noted that passes to the County parks will be changed to coincide with the calendar year, rather than the fiscal year.

**10-05 18 7** As this was the date and 10:00 a.m. the time set for a Public Hearing to amend the County Conservation Budget, said hearing was opened by the chairman. Rob Klocke, Conservation Administrator and Don Brommer were present for this discussion. Brommer stated that the building for which the amendment is needed is an all purpose building including office space, storage and a rest room. There were no additional comments from the public. The Chairman closed the Public Hearing. Motion by Wright and supported by Bloemendaal to approve amending the conservation budget for capital projects. Motion carried, unanimous in favor, one member absent.



**RESOLUTION 2010-10**

**RESOLUTION TO AMEND NURSE, VETERANS AFFAIRS, MENTAL HEALTH, JUVENILE PROBATION & GENERAL WELFARE SERVICES DEPARTMENT BUDGETS**

WHEREAS, it is unlawful for a Department Head to authorize the expenditure of a sum for a Department larger than the amount which has been appropriated for that Department by the Board; and

WHEREAS, proposed expenditures for the Nurse Department will cause this Department to exceed the amount budgeted for the fiscal year 2009-2010; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary to increase the appropriations for the Nurse Department to not be in violation of Iowa Code Section 331.437; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that the appropriation for the following Departments be changed as follows:

Nurse Department be increased from \$263,420 to \$283,420

Veterans Affairs Department be decreased from \$43,275 to \$35,275

Mental Health Department be decreased from \$2,811,028 to \$2,805,528

Juvenile Probation Department be decreased from \$42,000 to \$37,000

General Welfare Services Department be decreased from \$78,090 to \$76,590

**10-05 18 9 COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

- **Sybesma** – Reported that he served on a panel to represent Sioux County at a discussion regarding the impact of living in an area with many livestock producers. He stated that there was very good dialogue between the panel and the EPA. Sybesma stated that favorable comments were received regarding the cooperation between most livestock producers and their neighbors in the County.
- **Wright and Sybesma** – Attended graduation at NCC on Friday.

**10-05 18 10** Doug Julius, Sioux County Engineer

- Distributed maps showing detour routes that will be used during road construction this summer.
- Informed the Board that prices have been received for three Henderson tailgate sanders.
- Reported that quotes were requested for seeding the shoulder on L14 north of Boyden for work done last year. Mark's Landscaping will do the work for \$8,039.49.
- Noted that the purchase of two Gravel Pup Chassis is being investigated.
- Reported that repairs will be done on K52 south of Hull. Because of heavy truck traffic the road bed is in need of repair. Resurfacing of this road is scheduled for FY 2013.
- Motion by Kleinwolterink and supported by Bloemendaal to approve the 2010 Weed Resolution for Sioux County. Roll Call on Vote: Wright, Yes; Bloemendaal, Yes; Kleinwolterink, Yes; and Sybesma, Yes. Motion carried, unanimous in favor, one member absent.

**RESOLUTION No. 2010-11**

**WEED CONTROL RESOLUTION**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SIOUX COUNTY, IOWA:

That pursuant to provisions of Chapter 317, Code of Iowa, it is hereby ordered

1) That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any land shall cut, burn or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this Chapter, at such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming bearing seeds or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth of any other weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut, burned or otherwise destroyed on or before the following dates and as often thereafter as necessary to prevent seed production:

Group 1: July 1 for Leafy Spurge; Marijuana Plants; Perennial Pepper-grass; Buckthorn (Rhamnus, not to include Rhamnus Frangula); Sour Dock Perennial, Smooth Dock Perennial and Sheep Sorrel Perennial.

Group 2: July 1, for Canada Thistle; Russian Knapweed; Buckhorn; Perennial and Wild Mustard Annual.

Group 3: July 15 for European Morning Glory or Field Bindweed; Wild Carrot Biennial, also known as Queen Anne's Lace; Poison Hemlock and Multiflora Rose.

Group 4: July 15 for Horse Nettle; Perennial Sow Thistle; Quack Gras; Butterprint Annual; Cocklebur; Bull Thistle; Wild Sunflower Annual; Teasel Biennial; Puncture Vine Annual; Shattercane Annual and all other species of thistles belonging in genera of Cirsium and Carduus.

2) That each owner and each person in the possession or control of land including right of way in Sioux County infested with any noxious weeds listed above shall adopt a program of weed destruction described by the Weed Commissioner which in five years may be expected to destroy and will immediately keep under control such infestations of said noxious weeds.

3) That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land including right of way in Sioux County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done

and the expense of said work, including cost of serving notice and other costs, if any, to be assessed against the real estate.

4) Sioux County has discontinued the Annual Spot Spraying Program of noxious weeds and other weed types growing in Sioux County Secondary Road ditches. It will be the responsibility of each owner and each person in the possession or control of land to destroy said weeds in Sioux County Secondary Road Ditches.

5) That the County Auditor be and is hereby directed to cause notice of the making and entering the foregoing order by one publication in each of the official newspapers of the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sioux County be designated as a weed control unit.
