

MINUTES OF SIOUX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

MEETING HELD ON MAY 1, 2018

- 1) The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met pursuant to adjournment at 9:00 a.m. with Chairman Sybesma presiding. Members present were John Degen, Mark Sybesma, Arlyn Kleinwolterink, Dennis Wright and Al Bloemendaal.
- 2) Minutes of the meeting held on April 17, 2018, were submitted, and the Chairman declared them approved.
- 3) Claims were approved for May 1, 2018 as submitted by the County Auditor.
- 4) Tom Kunstle, Sioux County Attorney, reported that Lloyd Schlumbohm was sentenced to 10 years in prison on April 23, 2018 in Sioux County District Court for the crime of Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree.
- 5) Ryan Dokter, Sioux County Auditor, presented the following Secondary Road Fund Transfer Resolution for Board consideration. Motion by Degen and supported by Kleinwolterink to approve the following resolution. Roll Call on Vote: Kleinwolterink; Yes, Degen; Yes, Wright; Yes, Bloemendaal; Yes, Sybesma; Yes. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION 2018-14

SECONDARY ROAD FUND TRANSFER

WHEREAS, it is desired to make the following inter-fund operating transfer:

\$1,189,500.00 from the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund,

WHEREAS, said operating transfer is made in accordance with Section 331.432 Iowa Code,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Sioux County as follows:

Section 1. The following inter-fund operating transfer is to be made effective May 1, 2018.

\$1,189,500.00 from the Rural Basic Fund to the Secondary Road Fund

Section 2. The County Auditor is directed to correct the books accordingly and to notify the County Treasurer of these inter-fund operating transfers, accompanied by a copy of this resolution and the record of its adoption.

- 6) Shane Walter, Sioux Rivers Mental Health CEO,
 - Presented a lease agreement for space in the DHS Building that was vacated by Targeted Case Management. The lease is between the County and Bruce and Jan Henryson for two offices at \$300/month and is a yearly commitment. Motion by

Wright and supported by Bloemendaal to approve the lease agreement. Motion carried unanimously.

- Discussed the passage of HF2456 for the requirement of at least 6 access centers across the state. These access centers are required to be community based.

7) Ryan Dokter, Sioux County Auditor,

As this was the time 9:30 a.m. and date, May 1, 2018 set for a Public Hearing to consider Sioux County Ordinance No. 27. The Chairman opened the said Public Hearing.

Ryan Dokter, Sioux County Auditor read the proposed ordinance. The following is the summary of the ordinance: The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the operation of All-Terrain Vehicles and/or Off-Road Utility Vehicles on county roadways designated by the Sioux County Board of Supervisors.

Written comment was received from Heather Hofmeyer stating “The only thing I’m questioning in it is the use of the orange flag. Our vehicle is taller than our suv and just barely fits in our garage. I’m not sure about affixing a tall orange flag to the back of it. My parents live in Jackson County in eastern Iowa and they do not need any such thing..... just my thoughts”.

Verbal comments were received from Mike and Melissa Gesink stating concern about the requirement for flags.

The Chairman closed the Public Hearing.

Sioux County Recorder, Anita Van Bruggen requested that language be added to the ordinance stating that the Recorder is authorized by Board resolution to collect a registration fee for the County sticker.

Board discussed the written and verbal comments about the flag requirement.

Motion by Bloemendaal and supported by Wright to remove the requirement for a flag on the vehicle and to add the following language to Section 5 Identification Requirements “The Sioux County Recorder is authorized to collect a registration fee as authorized by Resolution of the Board of Supervisors”. Roll Call on Vote: Kleinwolterink; Yes, Degen; Yes, Wright; Yes, Bloemendaal; Yes, Sybesma; Yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The second and final reading of the proposed ordinance will be May 15, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors Room.

8) Doug Julius, Sioux County Engineer,

- Reported that the contracts have been signed for the asphalt resurfacing project STP-C084(157)—5E-84 for B14 from the County line east to Jefferson Avenue.
- There will be a preconstruction meeting Friday for the aforementioned project.
- Updated the Board on Secondary Road activities.
- Distributed the 2018 Maintenance Line Painting Map for spring painting.
- In discussion with LG Everist on the gravel pit near Chatsworth.
- Will be doing gravel exploration in section 17 of Garfield Township.
- Working with the Hospers City Council on a speed resolution on Log Avenue.

9) Committee Reports:

- **Kleinwolterink** – 1) Reported on the Board meeting for the Cherokee Mental Health Institute. Their sex offender unit is full. Also the door handles need to be replaced throughout the facility and is very costly. 2) Attended a Safety Committee meeting.
- **Degen** – Read the letter received from the Sioux County Conservation Foundation indicating that 4.5 million in funding has been raised for the nature center project and that the project was awarded an Enhance Iowa Grant for \$600,000. In addition a USDA REDLG loan for \$300,000 was awarded from Northwest REC. Dirt work will begin this summer and bids and construction will begin this fall.
- **Wright** – 1) Reported on the YES Board meeting from April 20. An old bill was settled for \$3,000. 2) Reported the following from the ISAC Board meeting from April 26: 46 counties are involved in the opioid litigation, 600 people were in attendance at the ISAC Spring School of Instruction and the education tracks provided were not popular and will not be done at the annual conference in August, Precinct Atlas was discussed, County Risk Management Services were discussed, a new office communication software called Basecamp was implemented, and legislative updates were provided and it appears the backfill will still be there for FY2019.
- **Sybesma** – Received a thank you note from NISO for the County contribution for FY2019.
- **Bloemendaal** – 1) Attended the Northwest Iowa Planning meeting in Spencer on April 19. Reported that the agency will be creating a Facebook page to share information. 2) April 19, attended a RIDES meeting. The CFO Sam Johnson has resigned. 3) April 25 attended a MidSioux meeting and reported that on June 8, the 14th annual golf outing will take place in Sioux Center. Reported that the agency was awarded the Childcare Resource & Renewal Contract for 7 million dollars over a 5 to 6 year period. 4) Will present a new Conservation Board member for Board approval at the May 15 meeting.
- **Sybesma & Wright** - Reported on the Sioux Rivers Mental Health meeting from April 24. Discussion on the current 28E agreement, but there will be no change. Sioux County will become the fiscal agent for the Region July 1, 2018. Reported that the Jail Alternative Program has been working well.
- **Sybesma & Bloemendaal** – Reported on the Airport Board meeting from April 23. T-hangars have all been rented, bids were received for concrete paving for parking areas and Vander Pol Construction was the low bid, bids were received for a 100 x 100 hangar and NuAge Builders were the low bid, agreed to purchase some lawn equipment, and dirt work has begun for the MALSR system.
